T. I. S. IS 2ND; FOSTER VICTO IN 100 AND 220

Only Discus Mark Goes By Boards as Rain Hampers Meet

COOKEVILLE, Tenn., May 14,-(Spl.)-Coaches Harry Puckett and Joe Sills of T. I. S., Tennessee Tech alumni, returned to the scene of their college triumphs today and watched their proteges run, jump and heave their way to second place in the annual state high school track meet.

Surprising nobody, first honors in the T. S. S. A. A. cinder carnival at T. P. I. went to the prohibitively favored Knoxville High Trojans. who rang up wins in six of the 15 events, two seconds, four thirds and one fourth place for a total of 45 points.

The Industrial School, paced by the redoubtable William Foster, tallied 22 points to easily clinch runner-up laurels and after that it was Memphis Central and Memphis Tech, with 16 each; Kingsport, with 14; and Johnson City, with 12. Ten other schools were strung out behind.

TUCKER SPEARHEAD

The Trojans, who came here with a rocking number of record performances, were fortunate in having as the spearhead of their drive long, well-built Willis Tucker, who captured individual honors with 1514 points.

Industrial's Foster, winning over Tucker and the field in the 100-yard dash and the 220, his specialties. was a close second for the best single achievement of the day. He won 11 % points. Green Kelton of Tech High was third with 9.

The expected wholesale slaughter of existing state records became a forgotten newspaper promise as a cold, biting wind and rain swept over the track at aggrevating intervals.

Only one new mark was bought and Larry Partridge of the victorious Trojans purchased that one with a discus throw of 123 feet. The old record was 122 feet, set by Pounders of Memphis Messick High

Other marks were considerably below those on the books but the times and distances were remarkable at that, viewing the heavy handicap under which the athletes labored.

T. I. S. had one other first place. Hagen Peters threw the javelin 150 feet and 11 inches and nobody else came close. Foster wound up third in the broad jump, Holt got third in the javelin and the Bronce 880yard relay team finished fourth.

East High scored six points, Tommy Crook getting second in both the mile and the quarter and the relay team of Crook, Bohan, Condra and Ballou coming in behind Tech High in the mile event.

Tucker of the Trojans won the two hurdle events, was a member of the winning 880-yard relay team and placed in the 100 and 220-yard dashes.

The meet closed a highly successful season for T. I. S., tutored by Puckett, which won the district and the regional tournaments in Nash-
