## Slaughter Impressive In Record Performance

Antioch's Jon Slaughter may go down as the state's all-time cross country king.

JON'S THIRD straight title came Saturday at Percy Warner Park when he broke his own state record with a time of 14:45, 10 seconds better than his 1973 winning effort.

"I believe Slaughter's accomplishments in cross country will go unmatched for a long time to come," said East High coach Junior Ward, the state meet director who actually was Jon's first coach more than six

years ago.
"I know Jon has probably done more running than any kid his age. At least I can't imagine anyone running more than he has. I'd like to have a nickel for every mile he has run. But, it has paid off for him," said Ward.

MURFREESBORO Oakland's Dale Short was run-nerup to Slaughter and became only the second runner ever to break 15 minutes on the three-mile steeplechase course. The junior ran a 14:59.
