MBA's Corzine, Creek's Miller Capture Titles

Brooks Corzine of Montgomery Bell Academy won the TSSAA Decathlon and White Creek's Catherine Miller took the Pentathlon title yesterday at the McGavock High track.

Corzine, scoring 7,695 points, outdueled Clarksville Northeast's Stacey Thomas, 7,230 points, with a strong second-day showing — including the best performance in the triple jump, with 41 feet.

Miller, the TSSAA State low hurdles champion, capped a sensational year in track by winning the top points in three events yesterday — the 100 meter hurdles, the high jump and the 800 meter run.

Miller scored 4,555 points to outdistance Shegog, who finished with 4,505.

FIRST DAY RESULTS

Thomas Leading Decathlon Meet

Stacey Thomas of Clarksville Northeast used a victory in the long jump yesterday to the halfway lead in the TSSAA Decathlon Championships at McGavock.

Thomas jumped 20 feet, 5 inches to garner 870 points in the long jump. For the day the Middle Tennessee Region runner-up tallied 3,815 points.

Middle Tennessee champion Brooks Corzine of Montgomery Bell Acadmey was second with 3,685 points, followed by Charles Brown of Memphis Booker T. Washington with 3,565.

The meet concludes today with competition in the triple jump, discus, 110-meter hugh hurdles, pole vault and 1,600-meter run beginning at 9:30 a.m. The TSSAA Pentathalon Championships for girls begins this morning as well.

Other individual top performances yesterday were turned in by Mike Johnson of Knoxville Rule in the 100-meter dash (11.3 seconds), Craig Christenberry of Memphis University School in the shot put (42 feet, 9 inches), Bevan Carpenter of Memphis Woodale in the high jump (6 feet, 2 inches), and Earl Nichols of Woodale in the 400-meter dash (49.6 seconds).

Though Carpenter and Bevans each won events yesterday, they found themselves at the bottom of the standings after arriving late and missing the first three events.
