Jordaynia Ivie is a 5' 9" senior guard for Lakeway Christian Academy and a two year starter. She averages 15.3 points, 5.1 rebounds, 4.1 assists, and 3.7 steals per game. She shoots 47% from the field and 41% from three-point range. Jordaynia was named All-District this season and All-District as a junior. She was the District 1 Player of the Year this season and was an All-State selection last year.

Olivia Lee is a 5'10" sophomore guard for Trinity Christian and a two year starter. She averages 21.9 points, 9.2 rebounds, 2.4 assists, and three steals per game. 





2021 Division II BlueCross Girls' Basketball Championship Participating Teams




