

## BEDFORD CLUB IN ONE THREAT, LOSES 26 TO 0

**Muddy Field Helps  
Eastern Machine  
Whip Mid-Staters**

ELIZABETHTON, Dec. 10—(AP)—Elizabethton moved into the finals of the Tennessee High School football playoff today by defeating Shelbyville, 26 to 0, on a field made soggy by last night's snow. Approximately 3,000 saw the game.

The fast Shelbyville eleven found the unstable footing unsatisfactory for its elusive plays.

Using power plays almost exclusively, the Elizabethton team scored in the first, second and final periods. All but the third touchdown, scored shortly after an intercepted pass in Shelbyville territory, followed long marches.

### THE LONE THREAT

In the closing minutes Shelbyville threatened, moving to the 15-yard stripe where it lost the ball on an intercepted lateral.

Bud Hale scored twice and Harold Stevenson and Walter Maupin accounted for the other touchdowns. Hale made both extra points on line plunges.

Elizabethton kicked off out of bounds and after an exchange of punts took the ball on the Shelbyville 45 yard line. Using straight power plays they scored in a few minutes. Stevenson smashing over from the two yard line. Bud Hale plunged for the extra point.

The second Cyclone drive started on their own 22. Hale culminated the 78 yard march by slashing off tackle for the touchdown. A pass for extra point failed.

### SET SCORING STAGE

When the third period ended the Cyclones were once more inside the Shelbyville 10 yard line after a long march. Hale pounded across the first play of the final quarter and plunged for the point. A few minutes later W. Maupin, Cyclone end intercepted a Shelbyville pass and ran it back to the Eagles 35. He scored shortly on an end around play that started on the nine yard line. The plunge for point was inches short.
